Ricco Klecksolino

Quickly, get out your paint brush! A fun find-the-colour game for 2 to 4 little artists from 3 years.

Players: 2 to 4 players from

3 years

Contents: 4 cardboard palettes

(4 x 6 3/4 in./ 10,5 x 17 cm), 24 colour chips (Ø 3/4 in./2.2 cm), 9 action chips (Ø 3/4 in./2.2 cm).

Setting up the game

Take all the chips out of the artist's palettes and lay them face down in the middle of the table. Mix them up well. The action chips are not needed for this round.

Important: there should only be one whole set of colours

for each player

(2 players = 2 of each colour, 3 players = 3 of each colour, 4 players = 4 of each colour).

Each player takes an empty artist's palette and lays it on the table in front of him.







Story

Oh dear, Mr. Klecks the artist has stumbled and all of his colours have fallen onto the floor. Who can help him sort the colours correctly onto his palette?

Object of the game

The object of the game is to arrange all 6 colours correctly on your palette.

Playing the game

The player who last painted a picture starts and turns over a colour chip. He places it on the

appropriate place on his palette.

As the game progresses, if a player turns over a colour which he already has on his palette, he should return it to the table face down.

Handy hint: when a player returns a colour which you need, make a note of where they have laid it down.

The end of the game

The winner is the first person to fill his palette with all the colours and shout "Klecksolino".

Alternative game

Play the game as described above but add the action chips this time. With 2 players, each one takes 1 chip of each of the three different types; with 3 players, each one takes 2 chips of each type and with 4 players you use all of the action chips. Lay them in the middle of the table face down and mix them up well. The chips are then turned over in turn. If you turn over an action chip, you have to do the following:



Swap your palette with one of the other players. You have to do this even if your palette has the same number of chips or more chips than the other player's palette.



Well done, you've found the Klecksolino! Klecksolino contains all of the colours on

your palette and can therefore be used on any free colour. You cannot move it onto another colour later though.



If you turn over this chip, you have to sit out a round.

Let's get started! Who's going to be first to get all the colours on his palette?
